Circular Economy in DAY2

Circular economy is the central pillar of DAY2 Services - transforming building upgrades from waste-heavy, linear processes into reuse-first, landfill-free, lifecycle-optimised systems. Instead of *take* → *make* → *dispose*, DAY2 applies a *reuse* → *upgrade* → *repurpose* → *recycle* cycle that reduces waste and extends system life.

This isn't theory - it's embedded in every DAY2 workflow and underpins how we deliver sustainable, measurable outcomes.

1. Reuse Existing Infrastructure

This approach keeps budgets focused, reduces wasteful expenditure, and maximises the impact of every dollar spent.

Every retained component contributes to circularity, cost efficiency, and long-term asset value.

This model enables flexibility and scalability while cutting down on physical waste and embodied carbon. Less hardware means less waste - and more adaptability for modern building operations.

5. Responsible, Traceable Recycling

When components reach end-of-life, DAY2 ensures segregation, responsible recycling, and documented traceability - maintaining landfill-free processing and full alignment with Green Star's **Resource & Circularity** megatrend.

Every recycled component is tracked, ensuring transparency and accountability across the entire upgrade lifecycle.

6. Extending Asset Life
